# PRAYER FOR THE CATHOLIC CHARITIES APPEAL



## CASE FOR SUPPORT

The Catholic Charities Appeal supports beneficiary organizations and programs that provide essential, life sustaining services. A gift to the Appeal will feed those experiencing homelessness, keep after-school programs open, provide pregnancy support for women, impact programs for individuals with physical and intellectual disabilities, support mission parishes, care for our retired clergy, and so much more.

Available funds are distributed as follows:



### **SOCIAL SERVICES: 54%**

Every year, over half a million people are positively impacted by the work of Catholic Social Services and Nutritional Development Services.

### **EVANGELIZATION: 13%**

Countless lives are touched through support provided by various ministries within the Secretariat for Evangelization, including the Office for Life and Family, the Office for Cultural Ministries, and the Office for Persons with Disabilities.

### **SPECIAL EDUCATION: 12%**

The Schools of Special Education in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia provide a Christ centered program to meet the individual needs of more than 140 students. One of these schools, St. Lucy has the distinction of being the only Catholic school in the nation providing a unique program for children with visual impairments.

### **MISSION PARISHES: 11%**

22 Mission Parishes in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia are revitalizing and sustaining their community, including ministering to over 55,000 parishioners.

### **SICK AND RETIRED PRIESTS: 10%**

There are currently 131 retired priests within the Archdiocese who count on the support of the CCA.

Your willingness to work with us to ensure a bright future for our beneficiaries is deeply appreciated. You are truly making an impact and leaving a lasting legacy of love for the tens of thousands of individuals who rely on our support. Thank you!

## PREPARING FOR YOUR PRESENTATION

- Familiarize Yourself with the 2025 Appeal Review the latest case for support, brochure, or website to understand updates and how this year's appeal strengthens services for local families and individuals in need.
- Prepare a Meaningful Presentation Use a script or outline that reflects your personal style. Adapt sample talks as needed, but ensure your message highlights how the Catholic Charities Appeal provides essential support to our neighbors in need.
- Keep It Concise and Impactful Aim for a talk under five minutes, ideally around four minutes, to keep parishioners engaged and inspired.
- Share Your Connection Introduce yourself and explain how you've witnessed the impact of the Appeal firsthand—whether as a Board Member, volunteer, or through organizations like Catholic Social Services, Nutritional Development Services, or Special Education Schools.
- **Speak from the Heart** Focus on the services and programs that resonate most with you, particularly those that have directly improved the lives of individuals and families in our community.
- **Tell a Powerful Story** Real-life stories are the most compelling. Share an example of how a program supported by the Appeal has provided food, shelter, education, or emergency assistance to a local person or family in crisis. Help parishioners see how their generosity changes lives right here in our community.
- Lead by Example If you personally support the Catholic Charities Appeal, feel free to share why you give and how it strengthens your faith and commitment to helping others.
- **Highlight the Spirit of Gratitude** Encourage donors to see their gift as an expression of thanks to God for their blessings. Emphasize how their generosity directly supports local families struggling with poverty, illness, or other challenges.
- **Express Sincere Gratitude** Thank parishioners for their past generosity and invite them to continue making a difference in the lives of our neighbors. Let them know that every gift—no matter the size—provides hope and tangible help to those who need it most.
- Practice with Purpose Rehearse your talk aloud in front of a mirror or with a friend. The more
  comfortable you are, the better you can convey the urgency and importance of supporting
  our local brothers and sisters in need.

## SUGGESTIONS FOR YOUR PRESENTATION

### **BEFORE YOU ARRIVE**

- Confirm details with the pastor or parish contact days in advance.
  - When and at which Masses you will speak (typically after Communion).
  - Where to check in and with whom.
  - Whether celebrants are aware of your presentation.
- Arrive 15 minutes before Mass to introduce yourself to the Celebrant

### **DELIVERING YOUR PRESENTATION**

- Speak clearly and slowly for better understanding.
- **Be sincere and confident**—your faith and enthusiasm matter.
- Engage the congregation with eye contact and a warm, genuine smile.
- Use gestures and vocal variety to add energy and emphasis.
- Maintain good posture-stand tall and steady.
- Make it personal—your heartfelt words can and do inspire generosity.

## SAMPLE PRESENTATION

Good morning, friends. I'm [*Name*], and I'm honored to share a few words with you about the Catholic Charities Appeal—a mission that transforms lives right here in our community. [*If you are a volunteer, beneficiary, or donor, share that here.*]

## PAST PRESENTATIONS

#### **ED LIS**

Hi. My name is Ed Lis. I'm the Director of Catholic Mission Integration for Catholic Social Services. I'd like to thank Father \_\_\_\_\_, for inviting me to speak with you today on behalf of the Catholic Charities Appeal.

Every day across the five-county region, thousands of men and women are supported and helped by the work of Catholic Social Services, which is the single largest beneficiary of the annual Catholic Charities Appeal. Let me tell you about three.

Demetrius was 17 years old, a boy from the 'hood in Philadelphia who fell in with the wrong crowd, had a run-in with the law and was facing adult charges. The court placed him at St. Gabriel's Hall, a residential program for juvenile delinquent youth located in suburban Montgomery County. There he received a solid education and the support and redirection he needed to make better choices in his life. Now, Demetrius is a high school graduate trained in the building trades and employed in construction projects with a few other young men in upper Bucks County. That's the work we do ... the work of charity – your charity.

Nassir is a 9-year old boy who one day out of the blue suffered a life-threatening stroke. He survived but had to leave school for most of the year. When he went back to school after his recovery, he and his mother were afraid that he wouldn't be able to catch up. Thankfully, his school had an Out-of-School Time program offered after school that allowed Nassir to catch up, and feel supported and loved. He got the help he needed, and his mother says without that, he would never have been able to return to being the happy and confident little boy that he was before and is now once again. That's the work we do ... the work of charity – your charity.

Sharon was leading a normal, middle-class lifestyle. In her early 40's, living in a nice home with her family, until her husband abruptly left and later divorced her. That disappointment sent her into a tailspin of chronic depression that had been right beneath the surface but never diagnosed. Later, alcoholism led to losing her son and finding herself homeless on the streets of Philadelphia. Sharon, by the grace of God, found her way to Women of Hope at Vine Street, a homeless residence for women with mental health issues. There she received the support and love that she needed to rediscover her dignity and a brighter future.

Now Sharon has restored her relationship with her son, is living in her own apartment, and studying for her Associate's Degree while volunteering at a local animal shelter. **That's the work we do ... the work of charity – your charity.** 

These are just a few examples of the more than 175,000 people last year that were touched by the works of charity exercised by Catholic Social Services, made possible with the support of your generosity through your contributions to the Catholic Charities Appeal. So I come to you today on behalf of all those that we serve and all those staff and volunteers who do this sacred work, and invite you to be a partner with us in this mission of mercy.

I invite you to support the Charities Appeal ... because we are Catholic ... because the poor can't wait for a better time for us to give ... and because it's what Jesus would do.

#### **CCA BOARD MEMBER**
